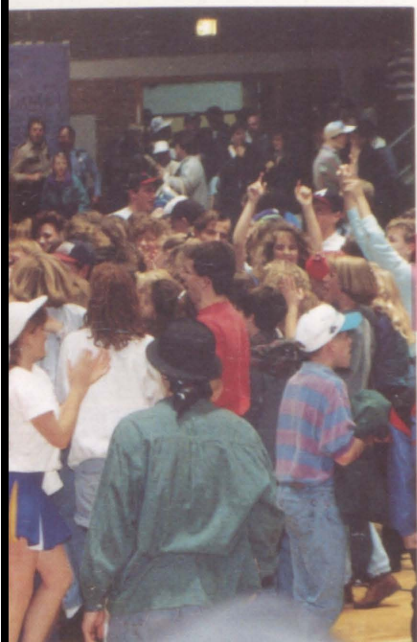
The air was chilly, so students gather around the annual bonfire after the powder puff game. In the end, the Eagles were roasted!

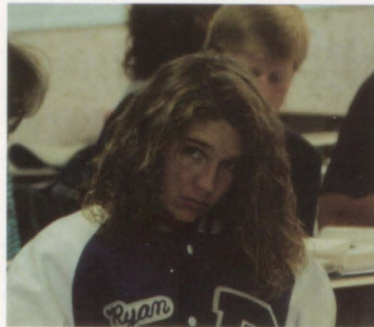

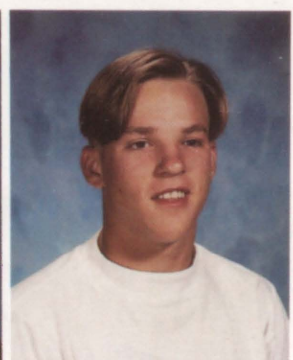
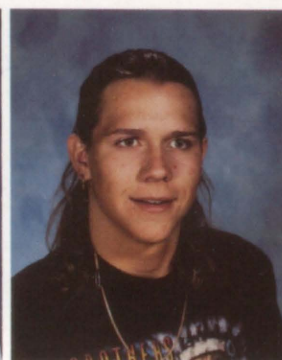

The things we will always look back on will be the great events that took place. Homecoming, The Unity Ball, our Senior trip, and most of all graduation.

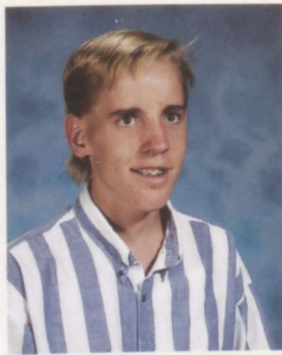

Throughout the 92-93 school year students complained of cramped halls, classrooms, the auditorium, and the lunchroom. Lockers were put in almost every possible location including the stairwells. Exciting things to do on weekends aren't always easy to find, but no matter what, the students discover a way to release their minds from the stress of school.

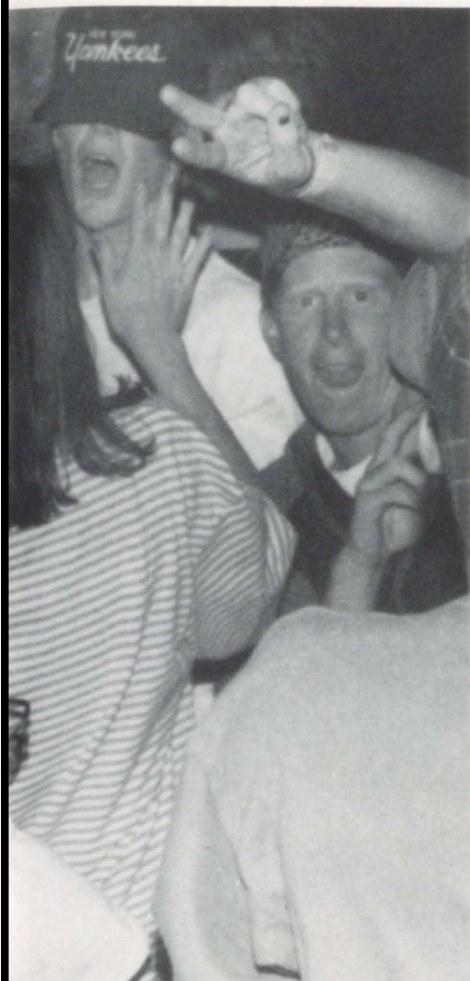

Everywhere you go, in everything you do, now and for the rest of your life, there will always be friends making the world a more exciting place.

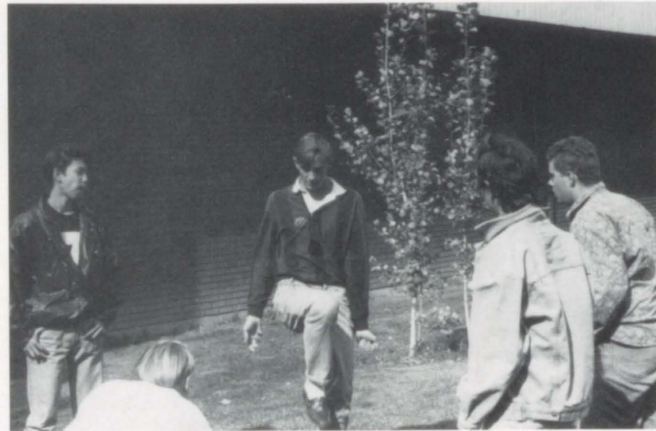
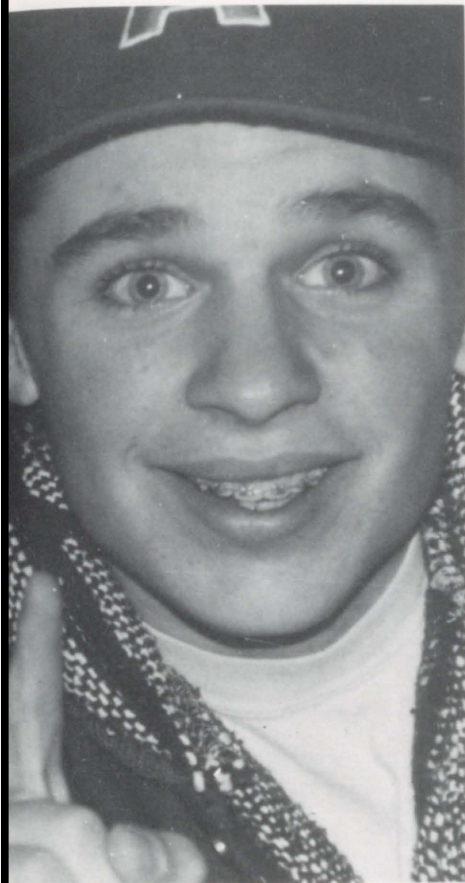

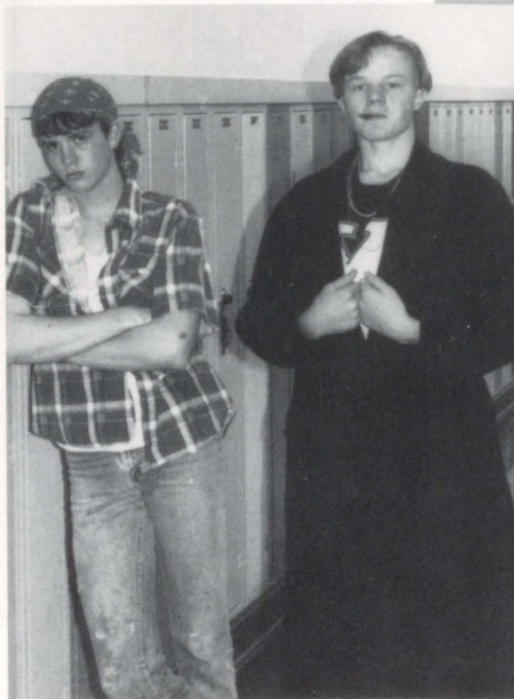

The dancers take a breather from the vigorous dancing and watch Adam sing the humorous song Bless Your Beautiful Hide.

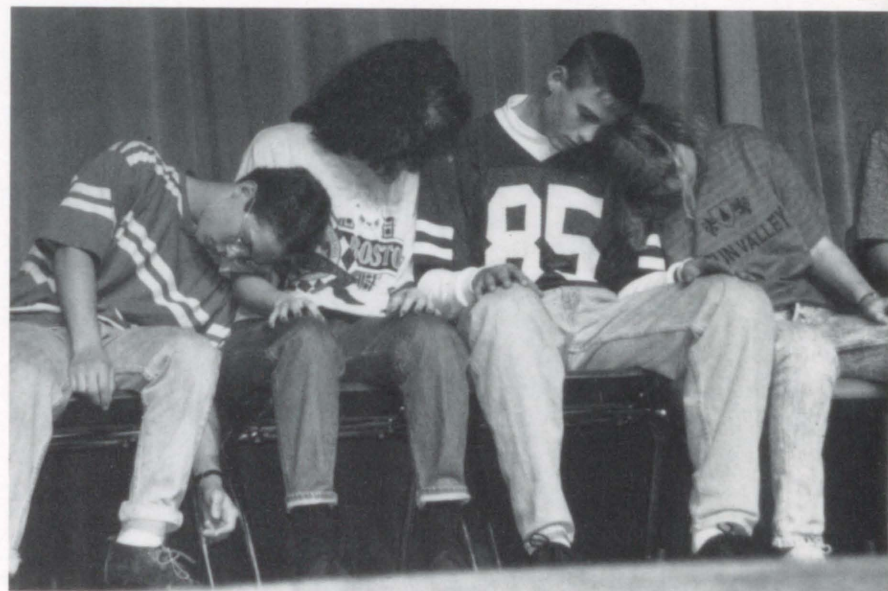

The reason why **Bryan Henrie** likes working at Riverdale Resort so much is because he gets in free. Bryan also commented on the hours, the long hours!

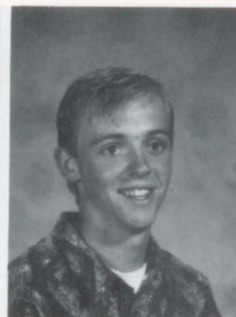
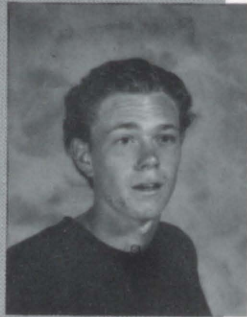

English was **Becky Woodward's** biggest stress. "I stayed up many long nights to finish To Kill a Mockingbird."

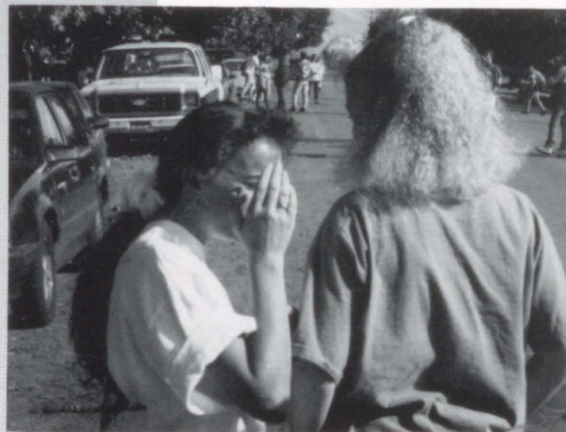

With over crowding a big concern, Mr. Bowler feels that our high school would make a superb junior high school! "It is a good building, but we are just to cramped."

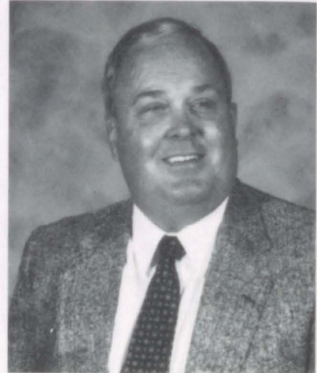

Obviously the teachers at P.H.S. have discovered that life begins at 3:15 P.M.

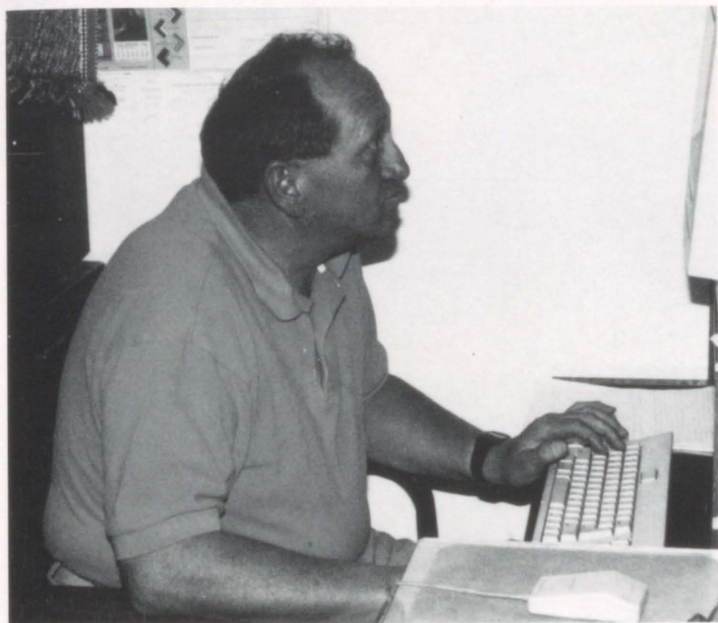

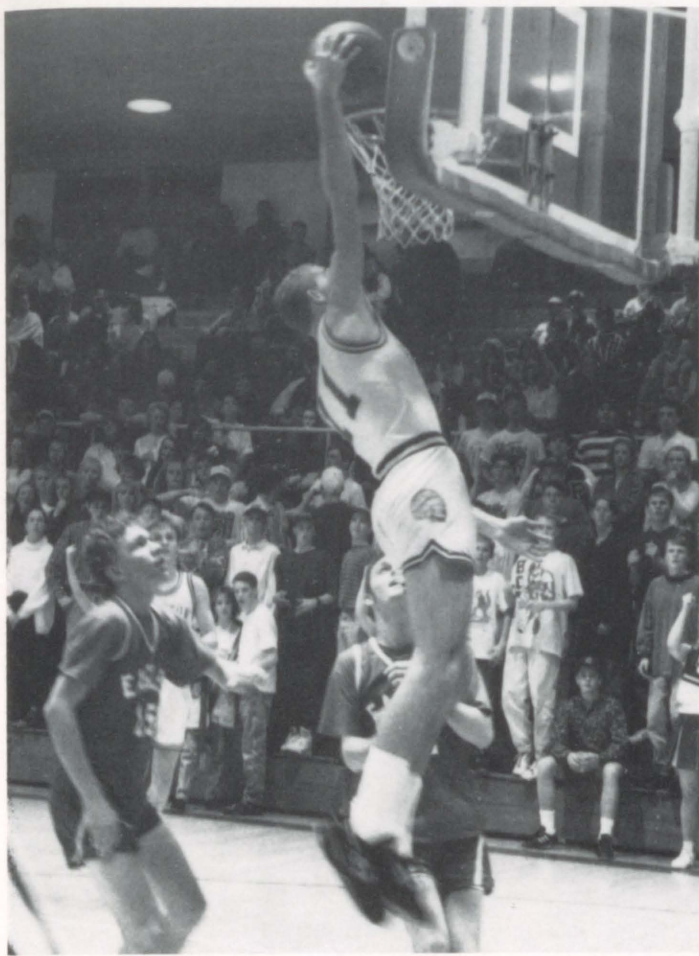

There were many goals set at the first of the season. To win the district championship, to place high at state and many individual goals.

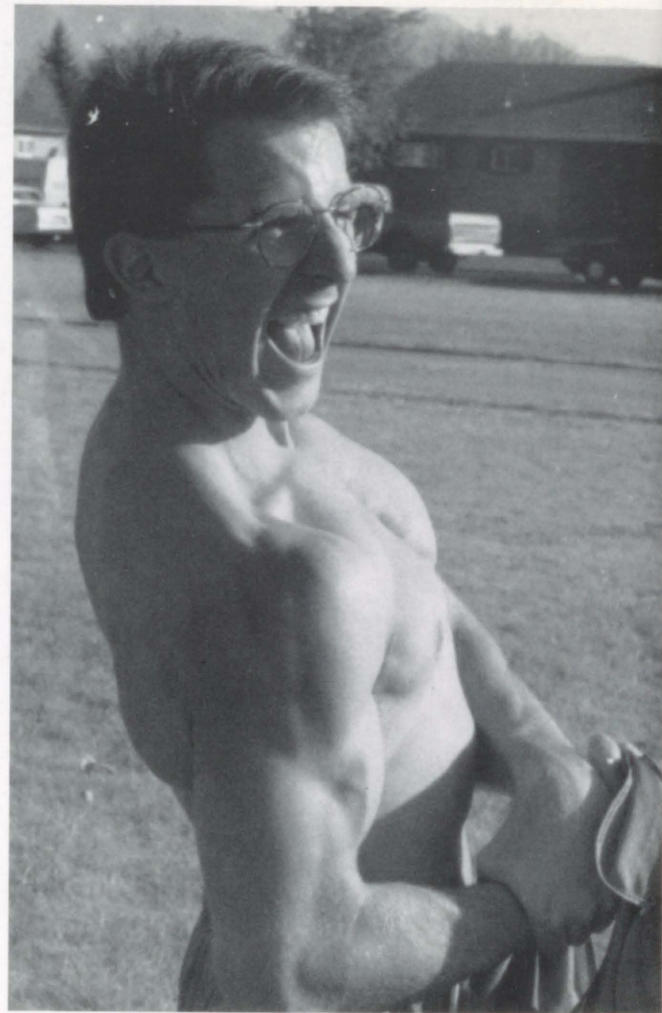

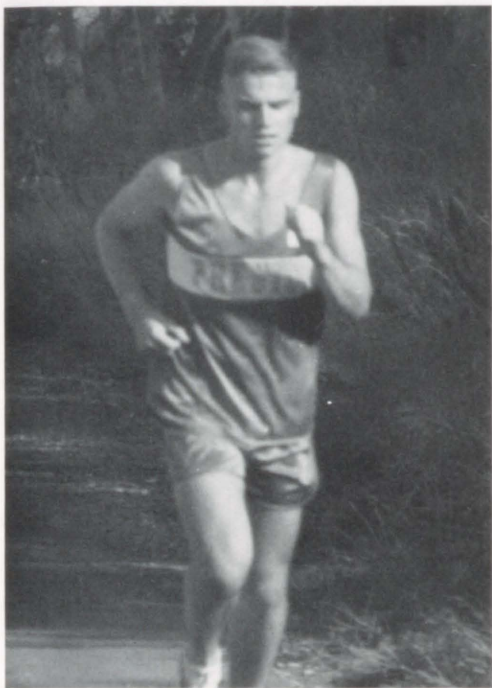

The girls practiced many long, hard hours knowing they were one

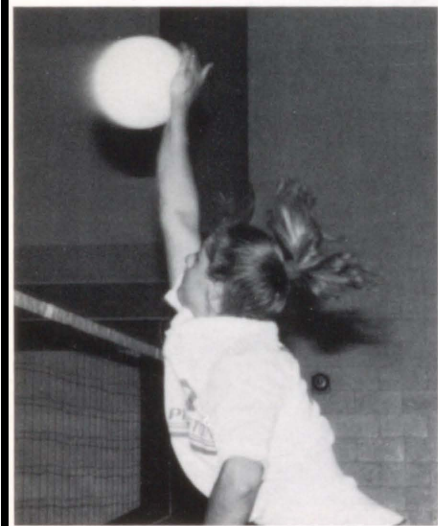

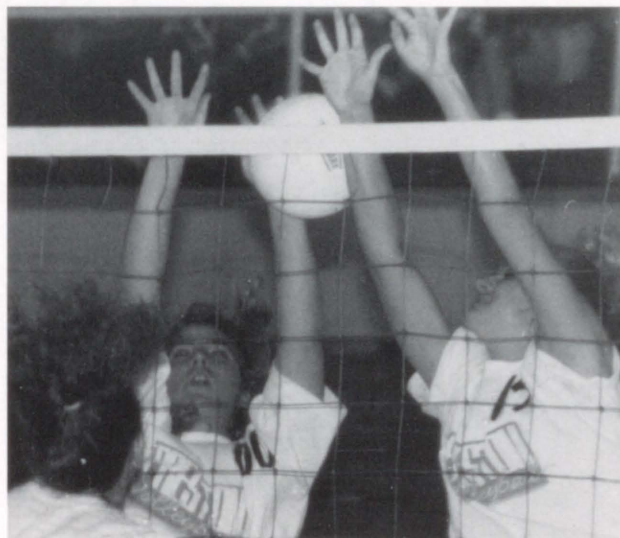
They proved to be one of the best teams to ever represent PHS by finishing 2nd in the State Championships.

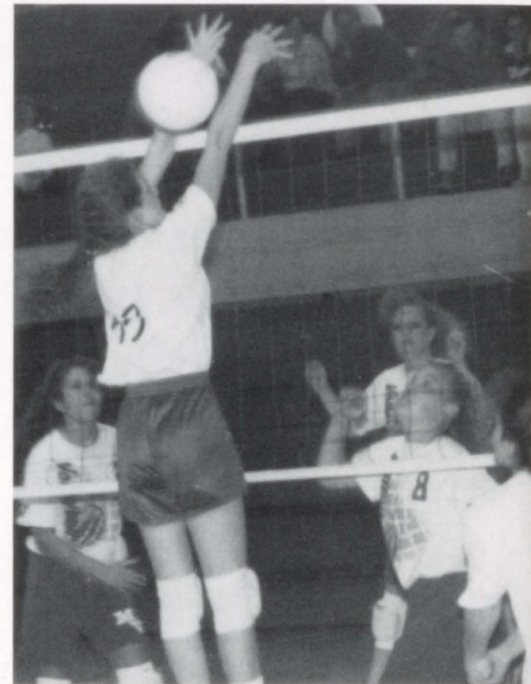

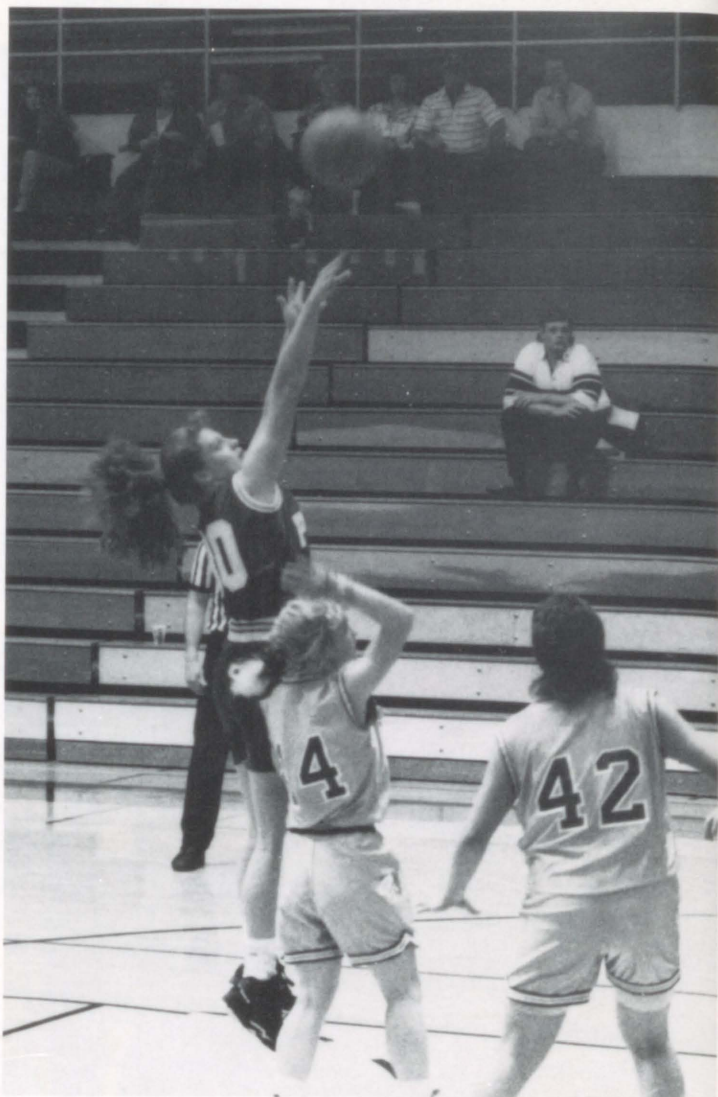
Heidi Keller said, "District and State was fun. It was a good experience.

Alecia Harris, 1st team district and 2nd team all-state, was consistent every game out. She provided great leadership and was a main reason to the success that was had.



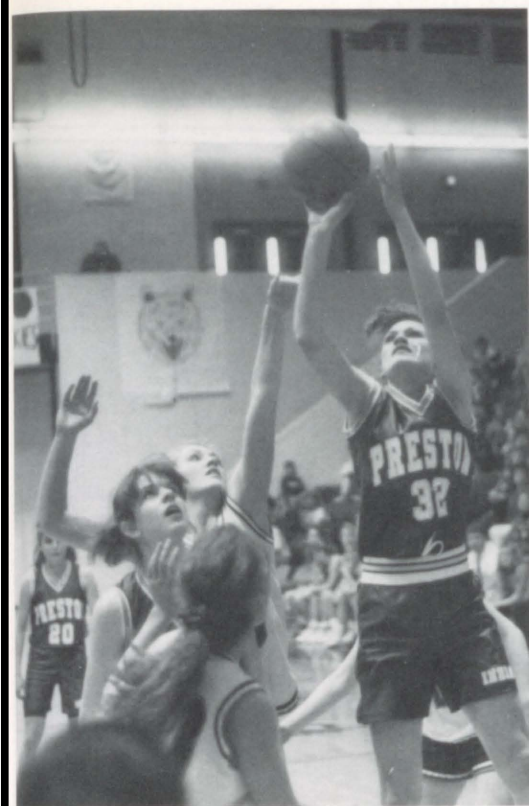

The J.V.'s determination for success won them many games, some against varsity teams.

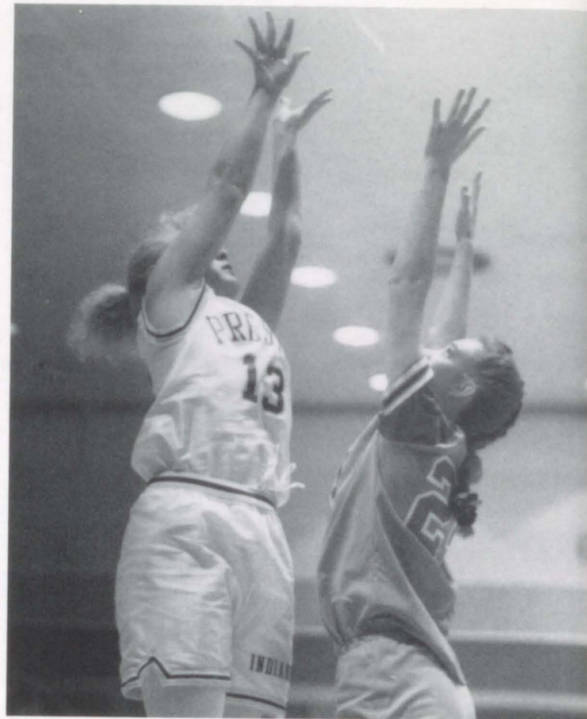
Coach, Julie Bovee said, "The J.V. team did twice as good as anyone thought they would. They had more teamwork than ever expected. I loved it!"

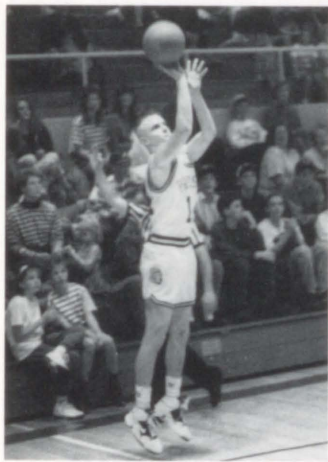

After fighting snow/rain for most of the spring, the team saw very little practice time and lost 7 games due to bad weather.

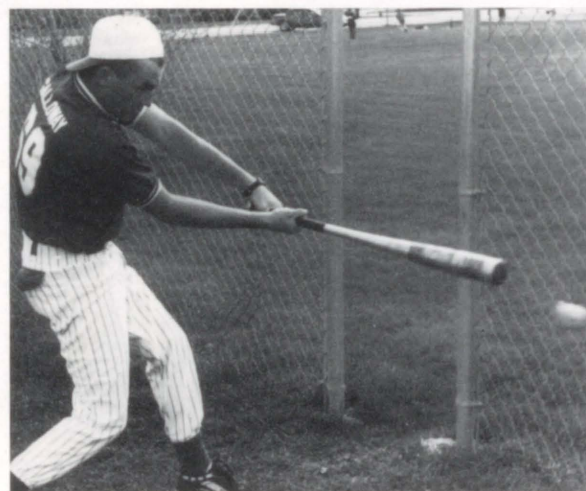
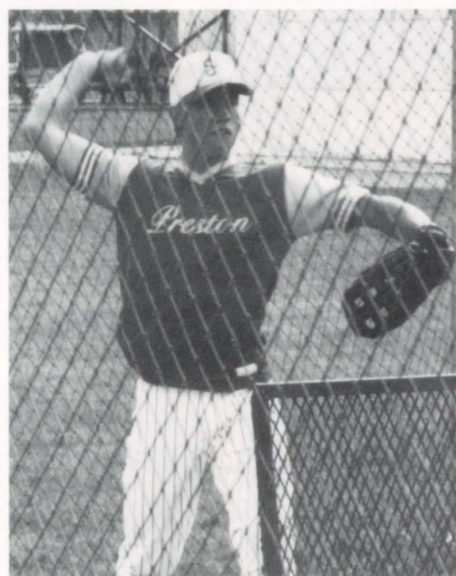

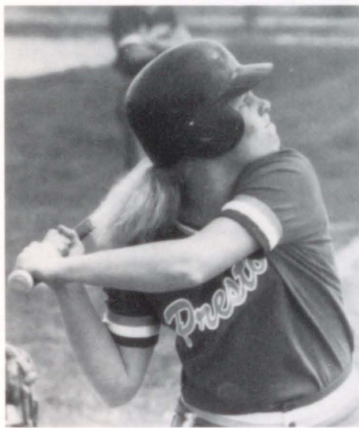

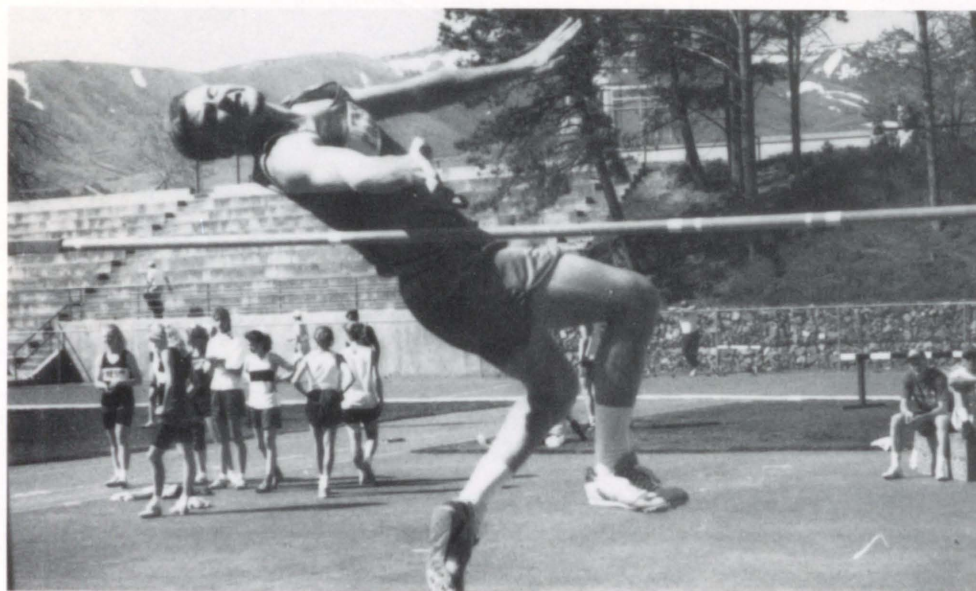

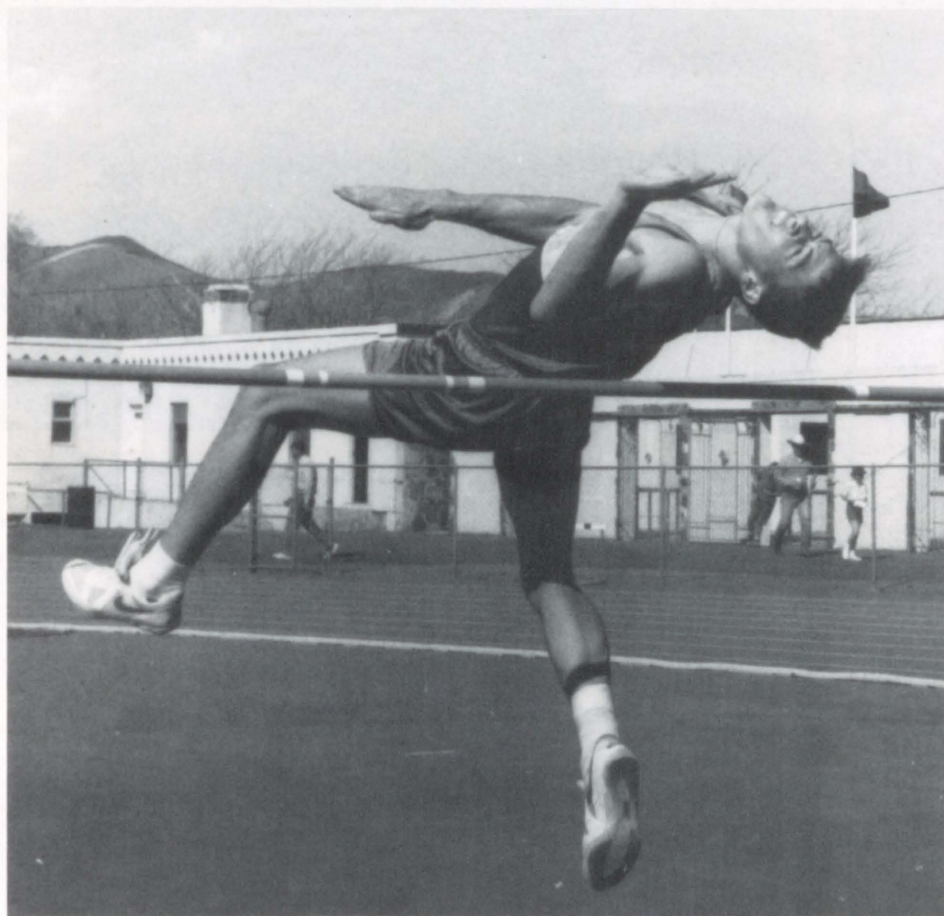

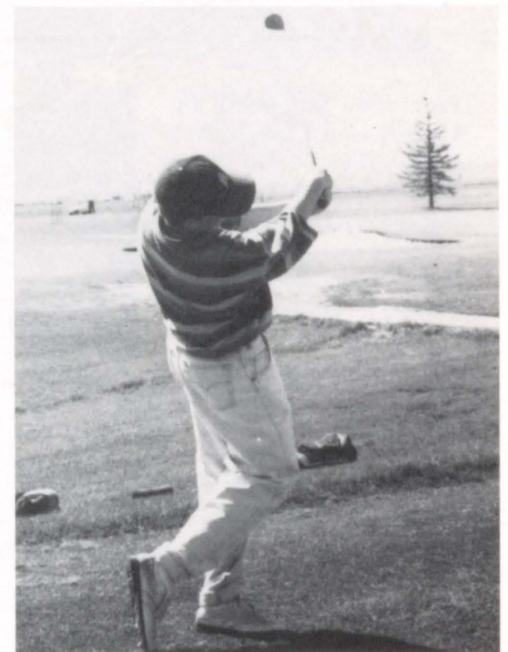

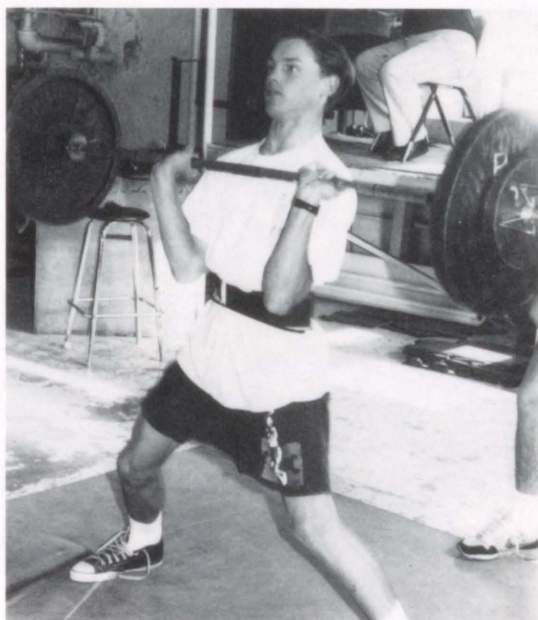

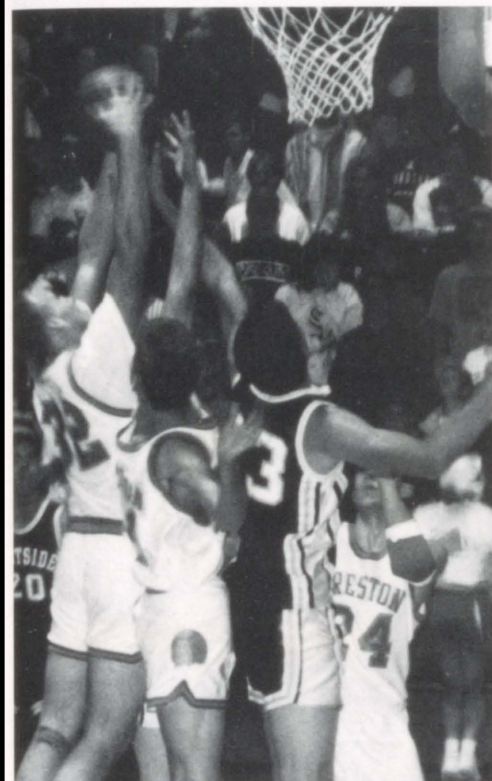

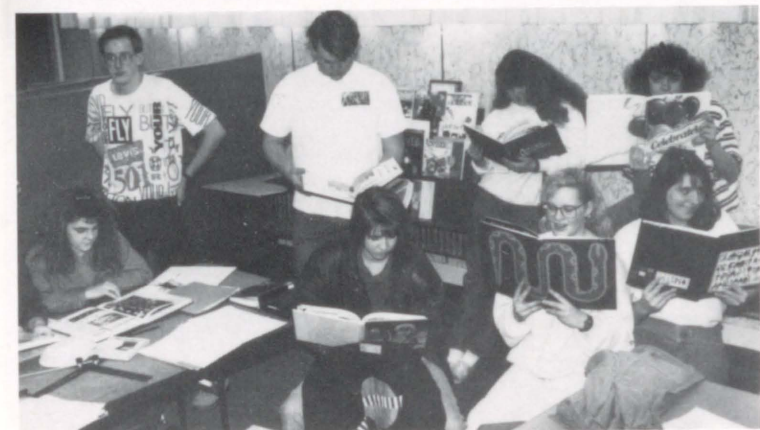

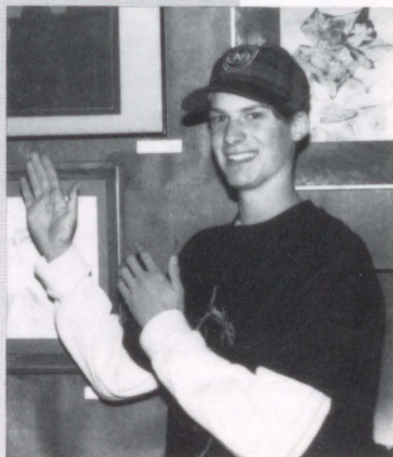
The size of the art club continues to grow, unfortunately for the Monte Carlo that is the prop for this years group picture.

Mr. Johnson sets a good example for his students. When he is not planning pay backs on Mr. Majerus, he to is a very accomplished artist.

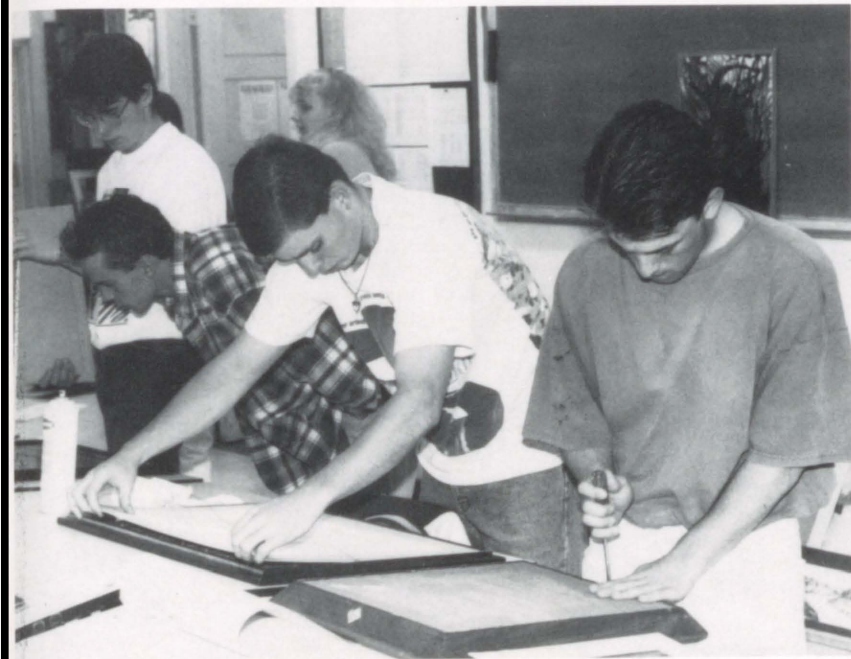

Before putting on the play, they went to Salt Lake to view it. That made it even more exciting for them to put the play on.



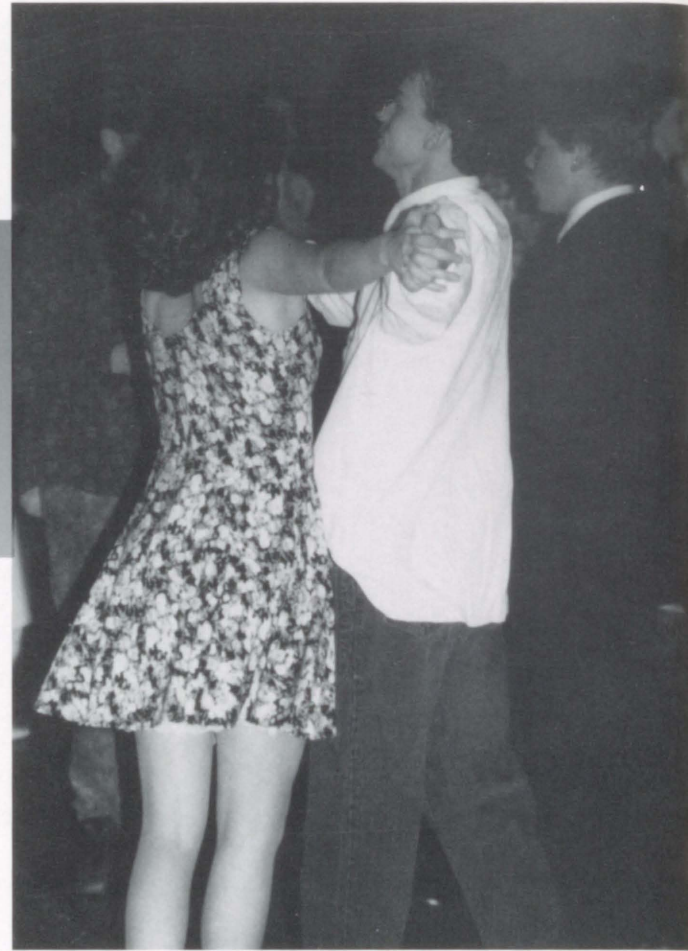

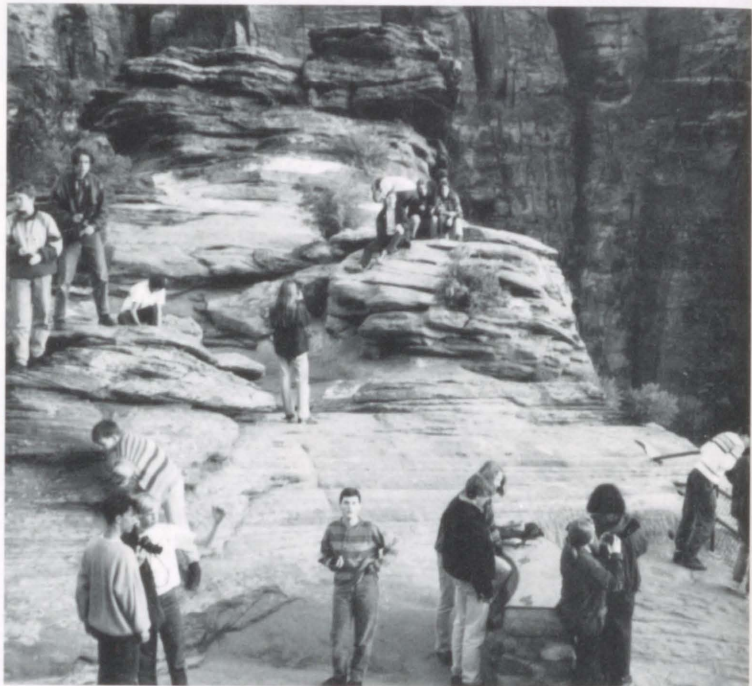

"To be a good rodeoer it takes lots and lots of work to train



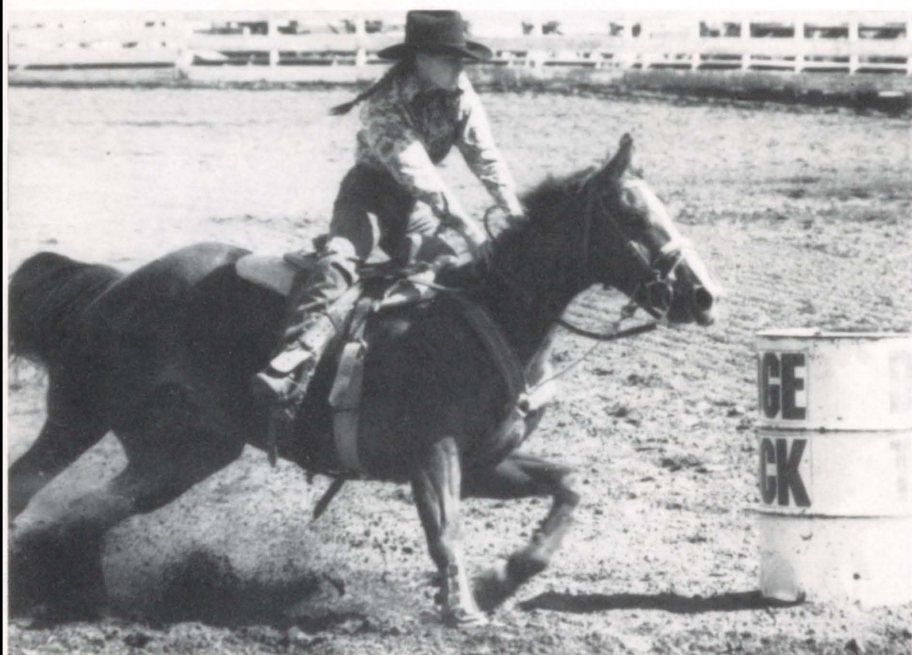
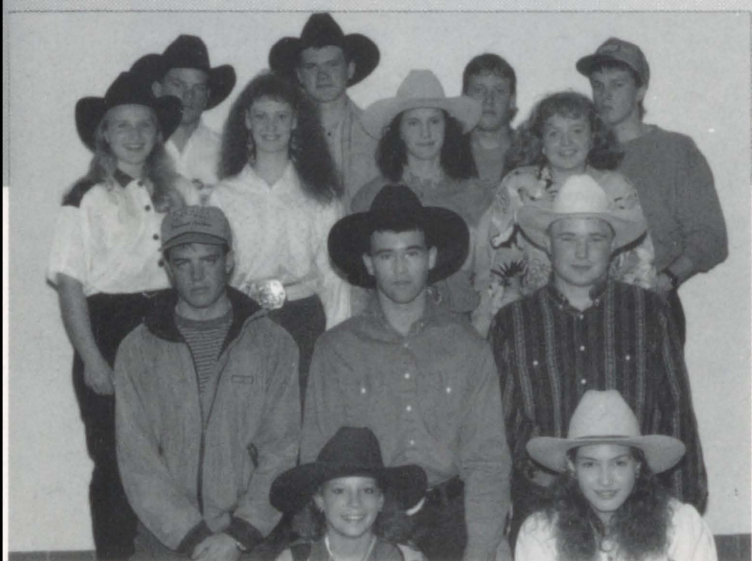
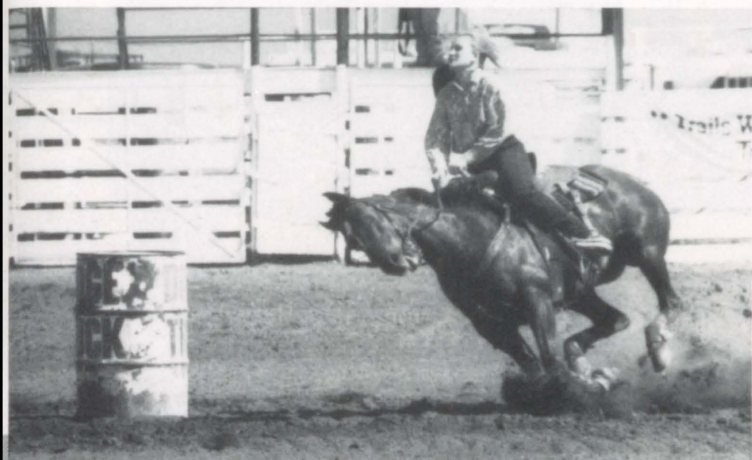
your horse as well as yourself," commented Lark Smith.

Facial expressions can be seen all over at Preston High School. Whether with some friends or by yourself you'll see them only if you look for them.

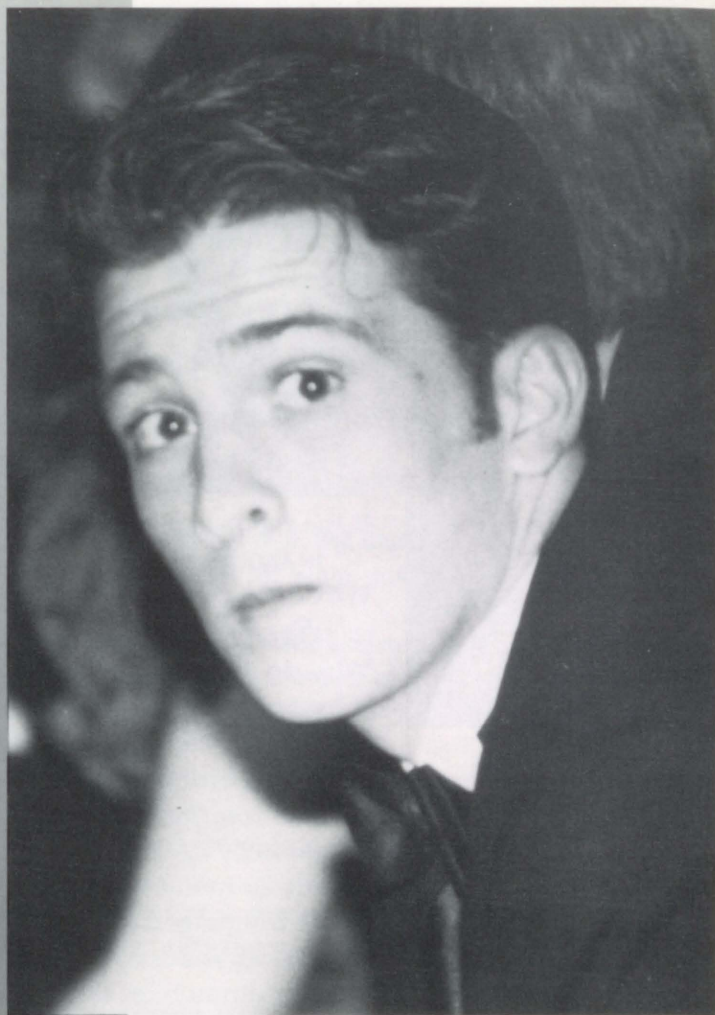
Coaches and players have them at ball games. Expressions show personality in the plays and musicals. A person can find them when eating food in the pit. Lunch time

Next time your talking to someone not only listen to them but watch their facial expressions. Facial expressions show the way we really feel when PHS is puttin' it on the line.

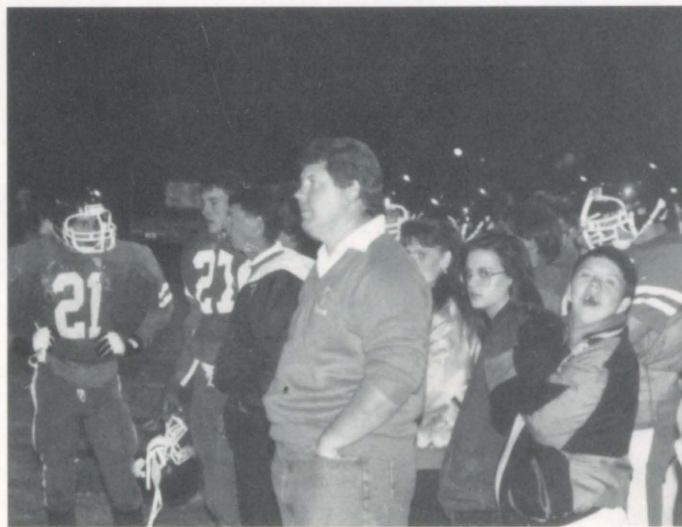
