

Keri Hinckley would like to, "Make it so the lunch ladies could come out and eat with the students, then we would become friends on a more personal basis."
















































Washington D.C . . . Close-Up!
































Christmas Concert:





























I would like to see Jello flavored like Della's




Luckily, we have many creative sophomores who have dozens of uses for bubble gum.








